Established in 1944, The College is a pioneer government-aided Arabic College, affiliated to the University of Calicut, approved by the University Grants Commission (UGC). It was originally affiliated to the University of Madras in 1955. Following the formation of united Kerala in 1957, the University of Kerala granted permanent affiliation to the College and has been under the University of Calicut since its inception in 1968. The college has been included in the 2(f) and 12(B) categories of UGC since 2010. And it has been comprehended as an Institution with minority status by the National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions, Government of India

#### II. Department of Economics with Islamic Finance

The Department of Economics came into existing in the year 2015-16 and is offering B.A. Economics with Islamic Finance, since its inception the Department of Economics has been at the forefront of organizing various academic programmes on relevant Economic issues.

1. On 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> August 2019, the Department of Economics organized a residential camp at the V-SET campus, Kalpetta, Wayanad for the students of the Department of Economics (only for boys due to technical constraints) to enhance the critical thinking in academics along with the emotional empowerment. The seminar was enriched with the active participation of the students of the college, Economics students and scholars from the different institutions.
- 3. On 12<sup>th</sup> December 2019, the Economics Club, Department of Economics organized an Economics Literary Fest named "ECOLUDE 2019" at Seminar Hall. The programme was inaugurated by the Principal Dr. CH Abdul Gafoor, the faculty members of the Department supervised the whole programme. The students actively participated in Group discussion, debate etc., on the various relevant economic issues and current trends in the Indian Economy.

On 6<sup>th</sup> January 2020, the Department of Islamic Finance organized a National Seminar on "Islamic Finance: A Catalyst for Inclusive Growth" in collaboration with, Islamic Finance Chair, University of Calicut. #### • Programmes for Advanced Learners and Slow Learners

The institution has set a screening process to ascertain the learning levels of the students and organises special programmes for advanced learners as well as slow learners.

In every academic year once the admission process is over, the competencies and caliber of the newly admitted students are regularly evaluated through department level specific programmes. At the end of the bridge course a multiple choice type examination is conducted by the respective departments which assess multi-level cognitive ability of the students. The students who score below 40 percentage marks are identified as slow learners and the students who score above 70 percentage are identified as advanced learners.

Besides, an orientation programme is conducted for the freshers under the IQAC to conscientize about the college, academic and co-curricular activities and detailed programme outcome along with description of the vision and mission of the institution.

Since this institution gives high priority to the attainment of the multi-level outcome we always encourage our students to enroll and share the platforms of NSS, Green Club, Students Initiative Palliative (SIP), Compulsory Social Service (CSS) programmes etc. apart from the active programmes of the arts and games conduct by the Students' Union. The college has well trained teams for athletics and games like football, cricket and badminton etc.
