

The structured questionnaire includes questions related to various aspects of the curriculum which are highly relevant to students. The survey includes questions related to the improvement of academic skills through curriculum, measurement of competency skills, sufficiency of additional skill, aware of human values and contents and objectives of curriculum design and importance of internal examination etc.




DIAGRAM.1 STUDENTS RESPONSE OVER CURRICULUM DURING 2023-24



INTERPRETATION

The data indicates that the curriculum and college resources generally support students' academic growth. Classroom communication and college facilities, such as the library and computer labs, are highly effective in stimulating learning, with mean scores of 3.76 and 3.72, respectively. The curriculum is also seen as helpful in improving academic knowledge and skills, with a mean score of 3.69. However, there are areas for improvement, such as the provision of academic-related seminars, workshops, and other activities to enhance creativity, which received a lower score of 3.31. Additionally, both the encouragement of extra and self-learning and the design of the curriculum to enhance employability received moderate scores of 3.35, suggesting room for further development. Lastly, internal evaluation processes are generally effective in promoting self-assessment and competency, with a mean score of 3.63.


1.1 The curriculum helps to improve the academic knowledge and skills of students



INTERPRETATION

The data shows that the majority of students feel the curriculum helps improve their academic knowledge and skills. Specifically, 36.63% rated it as "Good," and 27.72% rated it as "Very Good." A smaller portion, 25.75%, rated it as "Excellent." Only 9.9% rated it as "Average," and no students gave it a "Below Average" rating. 
1.2 Contents of the course ensure the learning outcome


1.3 Scope of Academic related seminar


1.4 College facilities and learning outcome


1.5 Classroom communication and learning abilities


1.6 Extra learning and self-learning


1.7 Curriculum and employability

1.8 Internal Evaluation



INTERPRETATION

The responses to Statement 8 show a generally positive evaluation. The majority of respondents rated the statement favorably, with 41.58% selecting "Good" and 30.69% choosing "Very Good." A smaller portion, 20.79%, rated it as "Excellent," indicating some strong approval. Only a few respondents rated it as "Average" (4.95%) or "Below Average" (1.98%), suggesting that most people found the statement to be at least satisfactory. Overall, the data indicates that the statement was well-received, with the majority of respondents providing positive feedback.

Action Taken Report on Student Feedback on Curriculum (2023-24)

The student feedback for the academic year 2023-24 indicates a generally positive response towards various aspects of the curriculum. The following actions are planned based on the analysis of the feedback:

- 1. **Curriculum Impact on Academic Knowledge and Skills**: 73.8% of students rated the curriculum as "Good" to "Excellent" in terms of improving their academic knowledge and skills. The mean score of 3.69 suggests a need for continuous enhancement. Action will be taken to review and update the curriculum to ensure more effective skill development.
- 2. **Conformity with Learning Outcomes**: 72% of students felt the course content aligns well with the learning outcomes. However, some students rated it "Average" (12.87%). To address this, the course structure and content will be reassessed to ensure better alignment with desired learning outcomes.
- 3. Workshops, Seminars, and Industrial Visits: 66.2% of students felt the curriculum offered adequate academic-related activities, but 15.84% rated it "Average" and 5.95% "Below Average." It is clear that there is room for improvement in this area. More seminars, workshops, and industrial visits will be incorporated to enhance creativity and knowledge outside of the classroom.
- 4. **College Facilities Support**: The feedback indicates that 74.4% of students rated college facilities, such as the library, computer labs, and e-resources, positively. The mean score of 3.72 suggests these facilities are effective in supporting learning, but continuous investment in infrastructure will be prioritized to maintain and improve these resources.
- 5. **Classroom Communication**: 75% of students rated classroom communication positively. With a mean score of 3.76, it's clear that teaching methods are stimulating students' thinking and learning. However, there is still scope for faculty to adopt more interactive methods to further engage students in the learning process.
- 6. **Extra Learning and Self-Learning**: Only 67% of students felt the curriculum supported extra learning and self-learning. Given the relatively lower score of 3.35, efforts will be made to incorporate more opportunities for independent learning and resource-based assignments to foster greater academic engagement.
- 7. **Employability Enhancement**: 67% of students believe the curriculum is designed to enhance employability. The feedback suggests a need to align the course with industry demands. The curriculum will be updated with more focus on practical skills and employability aspects to prepare students for the job market effectively.
- 8. **Internal Evaluation Processes**: 72.6% of students rated internal evaluations as effective for assessing competency and self-assessment. The mean score of 3.63 is positive, but the evaluation system will be reviewed for improvements in feedback quality and transparency to ensure better skill development.

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




FIGUER.1. TEACHERS FEEDBACK ON OVER CURRICULUM



The teachers' feedback reflects over curriculum generally positive opinions on the statements, with most receiving scores above 3.0, indicating a good level of satisfaction. Statement 1 received the highest mean score of 3.81 (76.2%), suggesting strong approval from teachers. Other statements, such as Statements 5 (3.77, 75.4%) and 6 (3.72, 74.4%), also received high ratings, highlighting overall positive feedback. 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
1.1 Modules help to deliver appropriate knowledge to the students


1.2 Content of the syllabus and employability


1.3. Updation of curriculum


1.4 The Curriculum is as per the need of the students

1.5 Curriculum and research




INTERPRETATION

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
1.6 Curriculum and self-learning


1.7 Curriculum Revision








Figure 1.1: Students rate on Curriculum




Figure 1.2: Curriculum Updating




Figure 1.3. Curriculum and Job Orientation



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


Figure 1.6:Rate of learning experience







Figure 1.4 Self motivated



Figure 1.7 Ability to take up extra responsibilities


